



AAWCC CHAPTER/SECTION FISCAL YEAR REPORT INSTRUCTIONS

Are you an officer or a member of a local AAWCC chapter or state section? Did you know that all qualified chapters/sections are **eligible** to receive \$100 each fiscal year from the national AAWCC organization? In order to receive this “bonus” each chapter/section must file an “AAWCC Chapter/Section Fiscal Year Report” by the deadline listed below. This report is required by AAWCC in order to comply with both IRS and AACC reporting regulations. Here are the requirements each chapter/section must meet to qualify for the “bonus”:

1. The chapter/section must have been formally approved by the AAWCC board of directors; and
2. The chapter/section’s membership must include at least **10** national AAWCC members (Institutional or Individual members) as of June 30 (e.g., the official membership date is June 30, 2010 for the fiscal year July 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010); and
3. The chapter/section must be active--offer activities, events, meetings that support the vision and objectives of AAWCC; and
4. The chapter/section must complete the AAWCC Chapter/Section Fiscal Year Report and submit that report to their **Regional Director** (contact information for RD is available on the AAWCC website www.aawccnatl.org) by **August 15, 2010**. Chapters/sections may submit their reports anytime between July 1, 2010 and August 15, 2010.

Your Regional Director will verify the information submitted by the chapter/section on the AAWCC Chapter/Section Fiscal Year Report and forward page two and page three of the report for each qualified chapter to the AAWCC Vice President for Membership by Sept. 30 and then the VP for Membership will forward page two to VP for Finance by Oct. 15. Each qualified chapter/section will receive a check for \$100 from the national organization by December 31, 2010.

We appreciate your completing this important financial, membership and activity report. Once we receive completed forms from all qualified chapters/sections, our plan is to update the AAWCC website to list the names of all the qualified chapters and sections in the country and contact information for one of their officers. This is just another way that we can all “champion women and maximize our potential”!

III. AAWCC RELATED ACTIVITIES:

In 2009-10:

- Rocky Mountain Chapter (RMC) increased its membership by 20%, which means national membership increased as well.
- RMC experienced a 33-50% increase in attendance at chapter activities that included leadership seminars and networking events. Although RMC is “housed” at Aims CC, participants came from other institutions throughout Region VIII: Arapahoe CC, Aurora CC, Front Range CC, Red Rocks CC, Colorado CC Systems Office, Laramie CCC (WY), Salt Lake CC (UT), Regis University, University of Northern Colorado, SunGard, and EMC Engineers, Inc.
- In 2009, Aims student Nichole Maxfield was awarded the Region VIII scholarship, and Natasha Maddox from Aims received the 2010 Region VIII scholarship. Both these outstanding young women were highly recommended to the Regional Director by the RMC scholarship committee, and both excelled in their academic endeavors and the financial assistance was greatly appreciated.

- RMC leadership developed a program that truly supports the AAWCC mission to champion women and maximize their potential. The 5-part seminar series, **“Developing Future Leaders—One Step at a Time,”** was a resounding success!
- Some of the most nationally well-recognized women in AAWCC and across the country participated in this leadership series investing their time and talent to help potential leaders of Region VIII. Topics and presenters included:
 - “Leading Change—Focus and Vision,” presented by Dr. Patricia Donohue, AAWCC past president
 - “Diversity in Leadership,” presented by Sandra Owens, house counsel for Aims CC
 - “Organizational Culture,” presented by Dr. Michele Haney, President, Red Rocks CC
 - “The Art of Negotiating,” presented by Dr. Martha Romero, former interim director of NILD and president of Collaborative Ventures.
 - The series grand finale was held on April 8. Over 60 attendees enjoyed networking, dinner, and a lively, interactive panel discussion. CEO panelists included Dr. Cynthia Bioteau, AAWCC president; Dr. Marsi Liddell, AAWCC past president; Dr. Michele Haney, President, Red Rocks CC; Patty Gates, Executive VP of Bank of Choice; and Sarah MacQuiddy, President, Greeley Chamber of Commerce.
- RMC frequently responds to the request for assistance from Aims Community College and the local community by providing volunteer service and efforts that support women and their needs.
 - In reaching out to women globally, the chapter recently made a donation to the Central Asia Institute (CAI), a non-profit organization founded by Greg Mortenson, co-author of *Three Cups of Tea: One Man’s Mission to Promote Peace, One School At A Time*, the book that was chosen as our community “Common Read.” Central Asia Institute mission promotes peace through education—especially for girls—in Pakistan and Afghanistan. The organization has built over 131 schools, which serve over 58,000 students, including 44,000 females. Several chapter members attended a luncheon on February 10, honoring Mr. Mortenson’s philanthropic efforts, where RMC presented him with our chapter’s donation.
- RMC also enjoys combining networking and fun. Region VIII Director Carol Hogle and RMC President Ann Grotness hosted a holiday gathering attended by over 30 chapter members and prospective members. The chapter also hosts an annual summer “leaders’ network.”
- In September 2009, Region VIII Director Carol Hogle and RMC President Ann Grotness met with board members from the newly formed Salt Lake CC chapter.
